The Recipients will move in their appointed order to the Chancel Each recipient will be named by the Recorder as each is to be invested with the Order's Insignia for the grade designated.

THE RECORDER:

Grand Master I present to you these Knight Officers and Knight Commander Officers for the honour of being invested in accordance with the Statutes of our Order.

THE GRAND MASTER:

With pleasure do I welcome these newly appointed and promoted Members of the Order. By authority delegated to me, I am about to invest you Knight Officers and Knight Commander Officers in the Venerable Order of Saint Hubert. The Badge symbolizes the Virtue of the Order — honour the Lord in His creatures.

As the Knights are being invested The Pipe Major shall play — "FLOWERS OF THE FOREST"

The GRAND MASTER shall say to each Knight as he is being invested Do you agree to abide by the Constitution of the International Order of Saint Hubert? Do you further agree to aid in the promoting of Wildlife Conservation? By virture of the authority vested in me and on behalf of this Venerable Order I do invest you with the Insignia of Knight Officer (Knight Commander Officer) and welcome you as a member of the International Order of Saint Hubert.

At the conclusion of the Investiture the Knights shall make their reverences to the GRAND MASTER and return to their appointed places.

Saint Hubertus

The Story of Saint Hubert, or Saint Hubertus as he was often called in Europe, is an interesting one, since it parallels in many ways the lives of other great religious figures of the Christian, Mohammedan and Buddhist religions. He was born in the middle of the seventh century A.D., of noble blood; his father was the Duke of Acquitaine, and his grandfather was the renowned Charibert, King of Toulouse. By the time he was a young man, he had achieved an extensive reputation as a bon vivant and one who was highly skilled at the art of stalking and hunting. He spent much of his leisure time in search of wild boar and stag in the forest of the Ardennes.

He was married in the year 690 A.D. to the daughter of a nobleman, and normally would have lived out his life following the carefully circumscribed customs of a titled landowner, had it not been for a curious incident which took place on a Good Friday, while he was on a stag hunt in the forest. His hunting party unexpectedly came upon a magnificent stag to which they gave full chase. During the melee, he became separated from his companions and found himself alone in a dark forest glade. The cries of the hounds became fainter and fainter, and he was left in a strange quiet that seemed to pervade the wilderness around him. As his eyes grew accustomed to the halflight, he saw before him, only a short distance away, the largest and most magnificent stag he had ever encountered. He spurred his horse to close in for the kill, when the stag suddenly turned around in its tracks and faced him, blocking his path. As he prepared to make the kill, he was astounded to see a cross appear between the antlers of the stag, brilliantly illuminated with a strangely beautiful luminescence. In the stillness, a voice seemed to speak to him, from the stag. It urged him to lead a holy life. Saint Hubert was so overcome by the emotional impact of this experience that he dismounted and

knelt to pray. The voice from the stag continued to speak to him, directing him to renounce his material possessions and offer his services to the Bishop of Maastricht. In spite of the intensity of this vision and its effects upon Saint Hubert, he did nothing about it until two tragedies occurred, which profoundly affected the course of his life; his wife died in childbirth and his father died shortly thereafter. As a result Saint Hubert divested himself of his military and ducal titles, sold his possessions and gave the money to the poor; he then offered the remainder of his life to the service of the Church.

In order to test his sincerity, Bishop Lambert of Maastricht ordered him to live for ten years as a hermit in the forest of the Ardennes, to humble himself and atone for his many sins. After this penance, he was sent by the Bishop on a pilgrimage to Rome. During the visit, the Bishop was assassinated, and the Pope then appointed Saint Hubert as his successor.

He spent the remainder of his life working amongst the people of the Ardennes, many of whom were pagan huntsmen, who lived by sword and spear as their ancestors had for a thousand years. Because of his good works in the forest among these people, he became closely associated with the huntsmen and woodcutters, who preferred the wilderness to village life.

Saint Hubert died on May 30, 727 A.D. at Tervueren, near Liege, where he was buried. Sixteen years after his death, he was canonized, and in 825 A.D. his remains were removed to Andain in the Ardennes, near a monastery and a town that were later named in his honor.

Because of his love of hunting and his close association with huntsmen, Saint Hubert became the patron saint of hunters and sportsmen, and has thus become a world-wide symbol of the best traditions of good hunting and good sportsmanship.

The International Order of St. Hubert is the oldest hunting organization of its kind in the world. It was founded by Count Franz Anton Sporck in 1695 and restituted by Albert F. Messany of Vienna at the request of Chancellor Figl of Austria in 1950 under the auspices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry. The Order is registered in the county of Kirchdorf, Austria.

Wherever you travel in Europe and wherever outdoorsmen congregate, you will see the time honoured universal symbol of the Order — a cross emblazoned between the antlers of a Royal Stag. This emblem originated in the 8th century when the Order was established in the Ardennes Forest which borders France and Belgium.

St. Hubert was born November 3 in the year 670. His birthdate is celebrated by sportsmen throughout the world. This date is a religious holiday in Austria where sportsmen meet in their traditional costumes in one of the many churches dedicated to St. Hubert, to receive their blessing and to repeat their sacred obligation—"To see that no free living animal or living plant will ever become extinct."

During the protectorate of Austria by the four powers, the United States, Great Britain, France, and the U.S.S.R., following World War II, the restituted Order had its rebirth in Vienna, and four American sportsmen and one Britisher became Knights of the Grand Chapter in recognition of the great contribution these men in their respective offices had made to the present and future welfare of the Federal Republic of Austria. These men became members of the North American Chapter.

Llewellyn E. Thompson, K.G.O., U.S. Ambassador General Mark W. Clark, K.G.O., Commanding General of the Allied Armed Forces in Austria.

Halvor O. Ekern, K.G.O., Chief Political Adviser to the Armed Forces.

George U. Wood, K.G.O., Consultant to the Ministry of Health for the Establishment of Hospitals and Health Facilities.

Baron Harold Anthony Caccia, K.G.O. High Commissioner of Great Britain. Former British Ambassador to the United States.

In 1966 George Wood was appointed Grand Prior and founded the North American Chapter in 1968.

The first investiture of the North American Chapter took place at the Bohemian Club in San Francisco on St. Hubert's birthday, November 3, in 1968, and Albert Messany, the Grand Master presided.

On November 3, 1975, Albert Messany, Restitutor and Grand Master announced his retirement because of ill health, and George Wood, having fulfilled all requirements prescribed by the constitution was elected Grand Master.

The purposes of this venerable Order are three fold:

- 1. To foster a spirit of brotherhood and fellowship among true sportsmen and to maintain the highest standards of sportsmanship among members.
- 2. To foster and encourage measures for the preservation of the habitats of wildlife and the conservation of such wildlife.
- 3. To encourage, sponsor and support all reasonable measures for the attainment of those objectives and purposes to the end that succeeding generations may continue to enjoy the heritage of the true sportsman.
