The recipients will move in their appointed order to the Chancel to take the Oath on the CONSTITUTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORDER OF ST. HUBERT and will then stand in line to be called by the Herald Ray L. Hommes, K.C., as each is to be invested with the Orders Insignia for the Grade designated.

THE HERALD:

Grand Master I present to you these candidate Knight Officers for the honour of being invested in accordance with the Statutes of our Order - And these Knight Officers for promotion to the Rank of Knight Commander of our Order.

THE GRAND MASTER:

With pleasure do I welcome these newly appointed and to be promoted Members of the Order. By authority delegated to me, I am about to invest you Knight Officers and Knight Commanders Officers in the Venerable Order of St. Hubert. The Jewel symbolizes the Virtue of the Order: — HONOUR THE LORD IN HIS CREATURES.

THE GRAND MASTER shall say to each Candidate Knight Officer as he is being invested: As you have sworn to abide by the Constitution of the International Order of St. Hubert and agree to aid in the promoting of Wildlife Conservation, foster a spirit of Brotherhood and Good Fellowship among your Ordensbrothers and Sportsmen. By virtue of the authority vested in me and on behalf of the Venerable Order I do invest you with the Insignia of Knight Officer and welcome you as a member of the International Order of St. Hubert. At the conclusion of his investiture the Knight Officer shall sign the Register and return to his appointed place.

To each Knight Commander Designate THE GRAND MASTER shall say: As Knight Officer of our Order you have proven yourself as a true Ordensbrother and have gained Merit in the Order. By virtue of the Authority vested in me and on behalf of the this Venerable Order I promote you to the Rank of Knight Commander. I do invest you with the Insignia of Knight Commander so you shall wear this Jewel with honour to our Order and pleasure to yourself.

to the GRAND MASTER.*

Saint Hubertus

The International order of St. Hubert is the oldest hunting organization of its kind in the world. It was founded by Count Franz Anton Sporck in 1692 and reconstituted by Albert F. Messany of Vienna at the request of Chancellor Figl of Austria in 1950 under the auspices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry. The Order is registered in the county of Kirchdorf, Austria.

Wherever you travel in Europe and wherever outdoorsmen congregate, you will see the time honoured universal symbol of the Order — a cross emblazoned between the antlers of a Royal Stag. This emblem originated in the 8th century when the Order was established in the Ardennes Forest which borders France and Belgium.

St. Hubert was born November 3 in the year 670. His birthday is celebrated by sportsmen throughout the world. This date is a religious holiday in Austria where sportsmen meet in their traditional costumes in one of the many churches dedicated to St. Hubert, to receive their blessing and to repeat their sacred obligation — "To see that no free living animal or living plant will ever become extinct."

During the protectorate of Austria by the four powers, the United States, Great Britain, France, and the U.S.S.R., following World War II, the reconstituted Order had its rebirth in Vienna, and four American sportsmen and one Britisher became Knights of the Grand Chapter in recognition of the great contribution these men in their respective offices had made to the present and future welfare of the Federal Republic of Austria. These men became members of the North American Chapter.

In 1966 George Wood was appointed Grand Prior and founded the North American Chapter in 1968.

The first investiture of the North American Chapter took place at the Bohemian Club in San Francisco on St. Hubert's birthday, November 3, in 1968, and Albert Messany, the Grand Master presided.

On November 3, 1975, Albert Messany, Restitutor and Grand Master announced his retirement because of ill health, and George Wood, having fulfilled all requirements prescribed by the constitution was elected Grand Master.

In June of 1979, The Grand Master, George U. Wood announced his retirement, because of ill health. Karl Christian Weber having fulfilled all the requirements of the constitution and the rules and regulations, was appointed Grand Master of the International Order of St. Hubert. Mr. Weber is a native of Austria and served as Honourary Consul General of Austria in San Francisco.

The purposes of this venerable Order are three fold:

1. To foster a spirit of brotherhood and fellowship among true sportsmen and to maintain the highest standards of sportsmanship among members.
2. To foster and encourage measures for the preservation of the habitats of wildlife and the conservation of such wildlife.
3. To encourage, sponsor and support all reasonable measures for the attainment of those objectives and purposes to the end that succeeding generations may continue to enjoy the heritage of the true sportsman.

INTERNATIONAL ORDER OF ST. HUBERT

● Mr. HAYAKAWA. Mr. President, I take this opportunity to comment on the fine work being done worldwide in the fields of enlightened sportsmanship and game conservation by the ancient and nonsectarian International Order of St. Hubert.

This order was founded as a society of hunters in 1692 by Count Franz Anton Sporck in what was at that time the Empire of Austro-Hungary. The order is named after Saint Hubert, born November 3, 670 A.D. in the Ardennes Forest which lies astride the Franco-Belgian border. His birthday is celebrated by sportsmen throughout the world, and the emblem of the order is a familiar sight all over Europe. At the end of World War II, the order was restituted by Dr. Albert Messany who became grand master of the international organization.

In early November of every second year, the officers and members of the order from Europe and North America gather in Grace Cathedral in San Francisco to honor their patronage and refresh their dedication to the principles of conservation and sportsmanship.

The first American grand master, George U. Wood of Orinda, Calif., passed away on the first day of 1980. His last wish on behalf of the order was that it be recognized in the official publication of the Congress of the United States.

The by-laws of the order provide that the seat of the order shall be where the grand master resides. The present grand master is Karl C. Weber, K.G.O. of San Francisco. He and other distinguished officers of the International Order have asked that George Wood's wish be carried out. It is my honor to inscribe these words in the CONGRESSIONAL RECORD, and to establish that California will again welcome the members from around the world at their meeting in San Francisco in November.●
